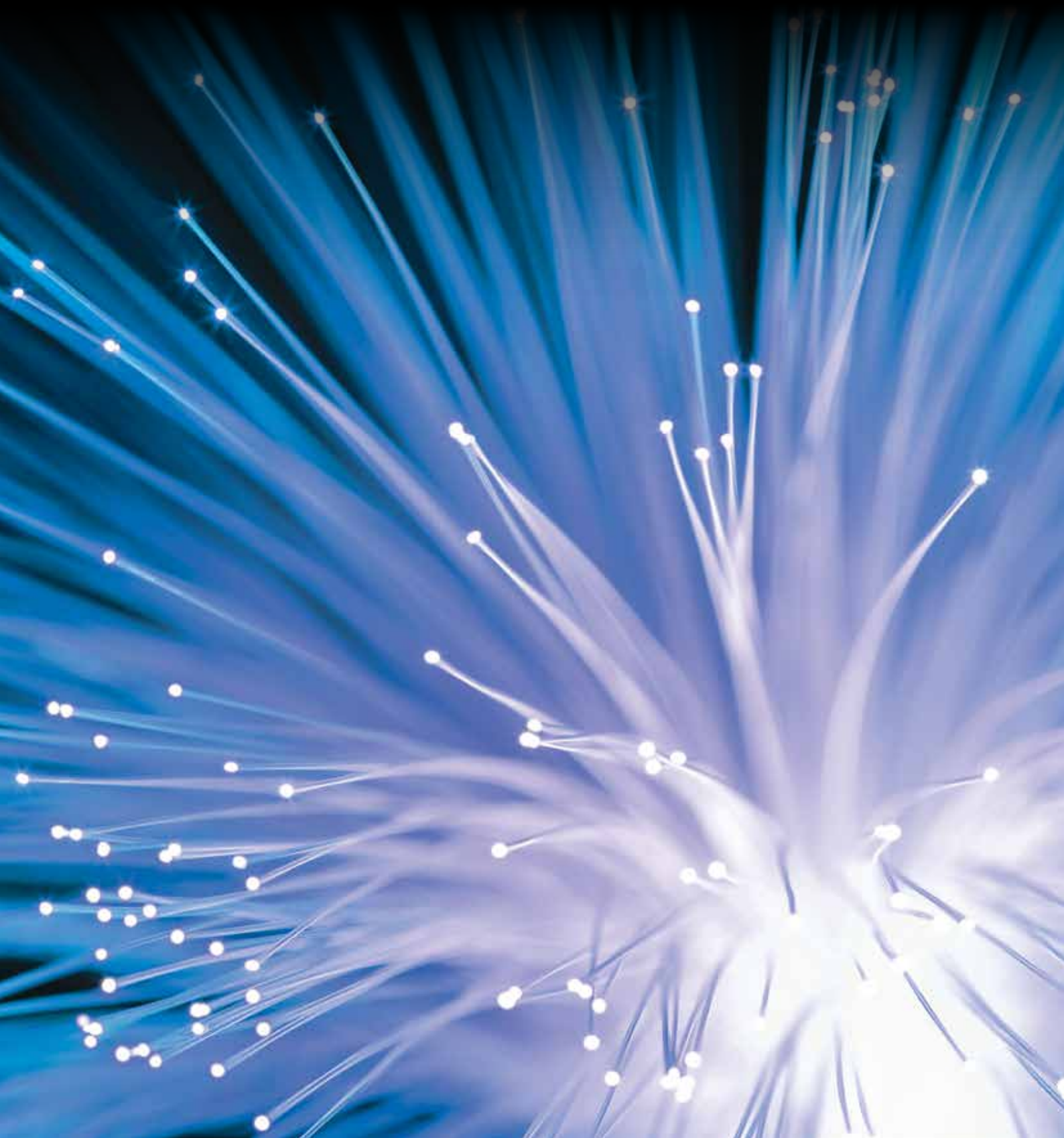

#### Entry requirements for double degrees

A double degree combines two bachelor degrees into a single course of study. You can complete a double degree in a shorter time than two separate degrees, saving you time and money.

You can apply via QTAC, listing the double degree as one of your course preferences, the same as you would for any single degree.

# Year 12 subject scheme

We offer adjustment schemes that can help you get into the course you want. This provides an adjustment to your selection rank. You can receive up to a maximum of 8 selection rank adjustments.

You'll need to have completed the equivalent of four semesters at senior school level (Years 11 and 12) with a passing exit grade in Specialist mathematics, Physics, Languages other than English (LOTE), Aerospace Systems or Engineering (for students who apply to study a QUT Bachelor of Engineering or related double degree) or university units (e.g. through START QUT).

You don't need to apply separately for the Year 12 subject scheme, QUT will calculate it automatically.

This scheme applies to 2020 Year 12 students applying for entry in 2021.

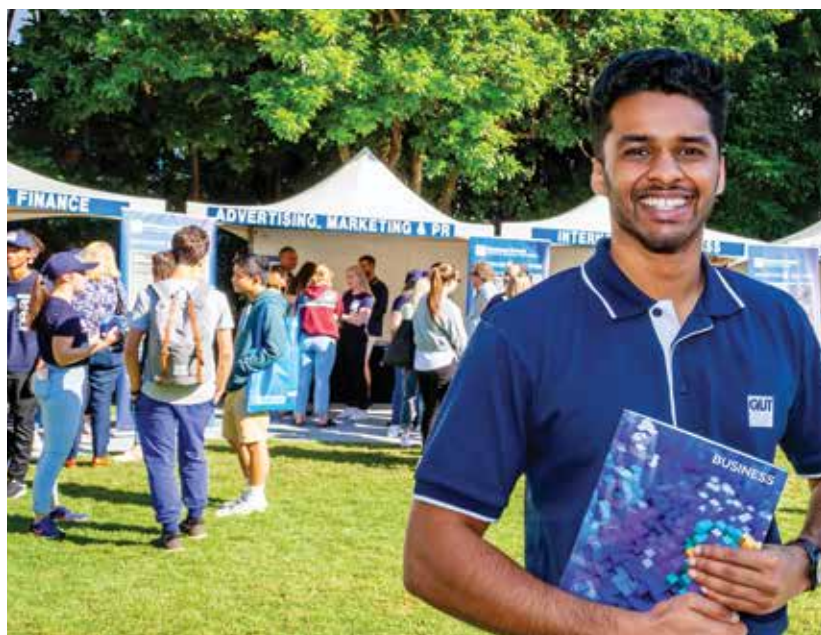
