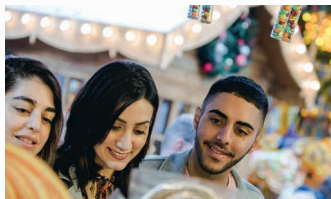

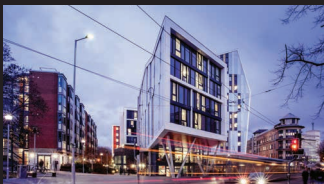

THE Awards 2020

As an international student, you'll need to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) as part of your visa application in order to be entitled to free healthcare through the National Health Service (NHS). Free healthcare includes:

- consulting a doctor (also known as a general practitioner or GP); and
- treatment in a hospital, including emergency treatment.

We strongly encourage you to register with a GP doctor soon after you arrive in Nottingham. You can do this online, or in person. We have medical centres on the City and Clifton campuses, and students at Brackenhurst campus register with the local medical centre in the nearby town of Southwell.
