




Living in Adelaide is easy, and more affordable than Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Perth.





Flinders Connect

Flinders Connect is the front door to student services at Flinders.

You can seek help from our team of knowledgeable staff via phone, face-to-face or online. You can also access Flinders Connect for specialist assistance in careers, IT and a range of support services.

International Student Services

For international students, including onshore international students, International Student Services (ISS) is the first point of contact and offers a range of programs and services. There are programs supporting your enrolment, study and social life, as well as a referral service to facilities on campus and within the local community. ISS organises a general orientation program for new international students, monthly morning teas and tours.

Arrival services

Flinders University is a leading Australian university in arrival support for new students from overseas. Before you leave home, ISS will assist you to plan your arrival in Adelaide. They will connect you with oncampus support services and staff in your academic area, making your transition to Flinders as smooth as possible.

Meet & greet

ISS offers a free meet-and-greet service for new international students. You will be met at Adelaide Airport, the railway station or the central bus station and taken directly to your new accommodation. The service is also free for accompanying family members. A booking is required.

Orientation

Childcare

Places are limited and booking is essential.

On-campus living

The Flinders campus is safe, affordable and convenient. Join a diverse community of students from across Australia and over 30 countries worldwide.

You have the option of living either at the catered University Hall or independently in the self-catered Deirdre Jordan Village. Both options offer academic and personal support from in-house tutors and coordinators.

University Hall

The University Hall is a catered residence with a strong collegial atmosphere.

The hall has accommodation for over 200 students in fully-furnished single rooms, secure storage and car parking, and small communal kitchens. You can mix with other students in common areas, sporting areas, the outdoor cinema, gazebos and gardens, including a landscaped central courtyard.

Deirdre Jordan Village

The Deirdre Jordan Village provides modern accommodation in self-catered, fully equipped units. It offers a range of culturally inclusive activities in the community centre.

The village has accommodation for over 350 students, living areas (some private), landscaped gardens and outdoor areas with barbecues, and secure storage and car parking. Single gender accommodation is also available.







Choosing to become an international student is a big step. But getting out of your comfort zone and taking on new experiences can often lead you down unexpected paths.

With his passion, creativity and persistence, commerce graduate Aaron Zhou saw his study at Flinders as an opportunity to grow a new business venture.

Established in 2008, Australia Morish Wine imports bottles of original Australian wine to China, and is partnered with some of Australia's – and indeed the world's – finest wineries. No doubt, Aaron's time spent in South Australia and its culture of winemaking excellence contributed to his decision to introduce these wines to people back at home.

Selecting the wines was a painstaking process. "Our professional purchasing team has inspected more than 300 wineries," Aaron said. "For their geographical culture, grape planting and picking, winemaking style and taste, we finally signed seven excellent wineries to be our strategic partners. They are: Lou Miranda, Turkey Flat, Turners Crossing, Gotham, Hanging Rock, Signature, and Morish."

It was while studying commerce at Flinders that Aaron was inspired to start the business, with his experience at the University planting the seeds for his successful collaboration. "It expanded my horizons and gave me a solid foundation in commerce. Also, I learned to be independent, confident and tolerant. Before graduation, my group did a research project about investment, which taught me the importance of practice and teamwork."

Morish has gone from strength to strength. "In 2010, after establishing our mainland headquarters in Chengdu, the company set up operations centres in Beijing and Guangzhou, and set up bonded warehouses in Shanghai to be responsible for the business of the whole country," Aaron said. Aaron's commerce degree continues to influence his success. "It gave me a better understanding of business running and management, and I still apply the knowledge at work," he said.



Forget the shovels, brushes and oversized magnifying glasses – the only time you will find archaeological pioneers Denise de Vries or Melanie Swalwell anywhere near a dig is when they are sorting through a box of old computer parts.

The pair are working on Play It Again, a project that seeks to document, preserve and use old computers and original software, in a bid to preserve key artefacts from our recent past.

"Without the project, there is a real risk that the heritage of early Australian computer and game design will be permanently deleted. And with computers such an integral part of culture, the loss of early Australian computer history would be a major blow," Associate Professor Swalwell said.

"Lots of our undergraduate students are really interested in the old software and devices we have; they love being able to come in and use the old computers, even just as a comparison with what they use now on a daily basis," Dr de Vries said.

Early home computers were frequently used to create and play simple games. Many of the games that were available in Australia were created locally, meaning the nation's video game history is substantially different from the rest of the world.

The Play It Again project involves rescuing both video games and the first generation home computers they were played on before all are lost to rubbish tips and bit rot. Associate Professor Swalwell and Dr de Vries work with technicians in a Tonsley lab cluttered with restored Microbees, Commodore 64s and other relics of the first wave of the digital revolution.

Dr de Vries handles the technical side of saving the data, the devices and the software while Associate Professor Swalwell examines the legacy of the games and computers through a cultural lens.

"It's really important to have the old computers themselves – you have to be able to save both the data and software which is on the computers. Without that software there's no way to access the data," Dr de Vries said.

"This project brings the digital experience of the 1970s and '80s back to life."







Engineering life-changing devices takes teamwork.

Cutting-edge medical devices aren't created by the stereotypical lone engineer working in isolation in a research laboratory – at least not at Flinders.

The University is bringing the best minds together to create tomorrow's biomedical solutions today through the Medical Device Partnering Program (MDPP).

Established in 2008 by Professor Karen Reynolds, the MDPP aims to form links between industry, researchers and health professionals. The Partnering Program has been funded by the South Australian Government since its inception, which has seen the majority of activity involving local organisations, but there has in recent times been a steady increase in interstate companies coming to utilise the service.

"Bringing together researchers, industry and medical teams from the start enables the Medical Device Partnering Program to deliver solutions quickly and creatively," Professor Reynolds said.

"Our projects run for around 250 hours. While this might not seem like a long time, it gives the team long enough to learn whether they can work productively together and also see whether there are opportunities in the near future to continue the working relationships."

The unique program has led to many new products hitting the market, ranging from Austofix's Ezy-Aim Electronic Distal Targeting System (an orthopaedic device that removes the need for multiple X-rays when fixing bone fractures) to INNOVO Healthcare's U Stand Frame (a lightweight, portable frame to help patients move from a sit-to-stand position).

"Working closely with end-users and clinicians we are able to respond to industry-driven problems, fast-forwarding the R&D process."

'FACTORY OF THE FUTURE' COMING TO TONSLEY

The welcome mat will go out at the new Tonsley Manufacturing Innovation Hub in early 2018.

High-tech and advanced manufacturing companies and researchers in South Australia will be able to use a new innovation hub at Flinders' Tonsley location to progress their product and business development.

Funded by a \$490,000 State Government grant, as part of the Australian Government's Innovative Manufacturing Cooperative Research Centre, the Tonsley Manufacturing Innovation Hub (TMI Hub) aims to accelerate the adoption of advanced digital technologies by local businesses and support the creation of highly skilled jobs for the future.

The new digital technologies hub will train businesses, students and others in the implementation of 'Industry 4.0' technologies and business models that will "revolutionise the way manufacturers connect with customers and suppliers through digital internet-based technologies", says Professor John Spoehr, director of the Australian Industrial Transformation Institute at Flinders University.

"The adoption of digital technologies in South Australia is giving rise to a new generation of manufacturers and highly skilled jobs," Professor Spoehr says.

"We welcome the opportunity to partner with the State Government and the Innovative Manufacturing CRC to establish a truly worldclass facility at Flinders University at Tonsley." The TMI Hub will provide practical training and real-world research opportunities for students, researchers and businesses wanting to learn more about automation, advanced robotics and the Internet of Things.

Facilities at the Flinders Tonsley location include the new generation of industrial robots – Baxter, Sawyer and UR5 – underwater vehicle development and testing capacity, a Faraday cage, a large hexapod robot for biomechanical testing, and a variety of digital manufacturing and rapid prototyping machines.

Professor Spoehr says the latest State Government funding will go towards the purchase of the Festo Cyber Physical Factory, a state-of-the-art i4.0 automation and robotics training and capability building platform.

Flinders University will contribute \$790,000 towards operational costs associated with the initiative – which includes employment of a dedicated industry engagement manager.

"The Tonsley Manufacturing Innovation Hub will play a leading role in Industry 4.0 training, education and capability building in South Australia," says Professor Spoehr.

"When I lost my sight, I couldn't practise medicine anymore, and that's why I'm in Australia to do this disability study.

"Now I've applied to Flinders to commence a PhD in disability studies in July 2017 to continue helping Nigerians with adultonset visual impairment and many other disabilities." Studying at Flinders as an Australia Awards scholar, Dr Bassey has received a letter of commendation from Flinders University's Chancellor and been recognised by the Golden Key International Honours Society for academic excellence

Vice-President and Pro Vice-Chancellor (International) Sebastian Raneskold says there are hundreds of nominations every year from across South Australia's educational institutions for the international awards.

"Emmanuel's outstanding academic capabilities, and inspiring career goals and personal attributes, made him a very worthy recipient of the International Student of the Year and Academic Excellence awards," Mr Raneskold says.

"Even more importantly, he will use his Flinders University study to further improve the lives of many more Nigerian people living with disabilities to reach their full potential."

Graduate entry to the MD provides an alternative to the traditional pathway from secondary school to an undergraduate medical course. The four-year program enables you to graduate with a medical qualification that is comparable to a six-year undergraduate program. The medical program aims to develop the elements of knowledge, understanding and skill central to varied areas of medical practice, producing graduates well prepared to act as hospital interns and with the potential to follow a full range of medical specialties in subsequent training.

STUDY PROGRAM

Throughout the course there are three broad topics or themes: doctor and patient, knowledge of health and illness, and health professions and society. The program focuses on student-centred learning with longitudinal development of the knowledge, skills, and personal and professional attributes required of a doctor. The Graduate Diploma in Research Methods is designed to provide you with high-level knowledge and skills in research methods, and the opportunity to develop in-depth knowledge in your subject area as a pathway to higher degree research. A research thesis/project makes you eligible to apply for various scholarship opportunities and entry into higher degree research.

To enrol at Flinders as a postgraduate student you must meet the following academic and English language proficiency requirements for admission:

Academic entry requirements

For graduate certificates, graduate diplomas and masters programs:

- For most degrees you must have satisfactorily completed a degree considered comparable to an Australian bachelors degree.
- Some degrees may require work experience to meet the entry requirements. A reference or statement from your employer will be required.

For masters by research and doctor of philosophy (PhD):

- For admission to a research higher degree program, you normally need an Honours Class 1 or 2A degree or equivalent, although other qualifications may be considered.
- Direct entry into a PhD is also dependent on the strength of your research background and you may be required to undertake a qualifying program if your research profile is not considered sufficient.

Some specific courses have additional entry requirements. These can be found at: flinders.edu.au/postgrad/apply

English language entry requirements

For applicants whose first language is not English you will need to have:

- achieved the required test score for your course as listed in the course index at the back of this publication. Test results must be no more than two years old on the proposed date of commencement of the course; or
- successfully completed an approved secondary or tertiary qualification, taught in the English language in a country where Flinders recognises English as the official language or the main language spoken (for up to an overall IELTS of 6.5 band scores) with evidence no more than five years old on the proposed date of commencement of the course; or
- successfully completed a pre-course English program from an approved ELICOS provider (evidence of completion must be no more than two years old on the proposed date of commencement of the course).

Other evidence of English language proficiency may be considered.

Pathways to Flinders

Don't meet our academic or English language entry requirements? There are other pathways to Flinders. Applicants who do not meet our English language requirements and need to improve their proficiency can do so through our approved English language (ELICOS) providers. This means you can attend the required English language tuition at approved ELICOS providers and gain direct entry into Flinders once meeting the required level, without having to sit an IELTS or TOEFL test.

Admission process

Admission to Flinders University is a simple four-step process.

Your application

Your offer of admission

Confirmation of enrolment

Arrival & orientation

Your application

Submit your application, making sure you include all the required documents as attachments.

Once your application is received by Flinders University International Centre, you will be sent an acknowledgement of your application being received and we will advise you if any further information or documentation is required.

Your offer of admission

Your offer of admission is usually sent out to you by email. If you do not have an email address we will post the offer letter directly to you or email your agent. We will endeavour to send your offer letter within 10-14 working days, however there may be delays where you have applied for a course with strict quotas or additional entry requirements, or where credit/exemption is sought for previous study.

Included in the offer of admission is a weblink to 'Your Offer Letter Explained'. At this stage you will be required to accept the offer by completing the acceptance form and any associated declarations. You will also be required to pay the relevant tuition fees for the first semester and visa-length Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) as detailed in your offer of admission.

Confirmation of enrolment

We will issue the Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) upon receipt of the signed acceptance, review of the declaration, and payment of fees and OSHC.

With the COE you can apply for your student visa. Please check your visa requirements at: homeaffairs.gov.au

Terminology

You may have come across some terms in this guide that are unfamiliar to you. This list of terminology will help you to better understand what we mean. You may also find it handy when visiting our website.

Academic English preparation (AEP)

Program aimed at improving your English language and academic skills prior to commencing study at Flinders University.

Academic staff

All teaching and research staff, including professors (the most senior), associate professors or readers, senior lecturers, lecturers, associate lecturers and tutors.

Academic year

Begins in late February or early March and ends in late November.

Australian central standard time (ACST)

Time zone for Adelaide and South Australia.

Award

A degree, certificate, diploma, masters or PhD of the University granted at the completion of a course of study.

Bachelor degree

Normally the basic (first) undergraduate degree.

Central business district (CBD)

The commercial and business centre of a city.

Confirmation of enrolment (COE)

A COE is a document provided by the University to an international student who studies in Australia on a student visa. It confirms that an international student is eligible to enrol in a course. You do not need a COE if you are a local student, or an international student studying in Australia on an AusAID Scholarship, or on a temporary residence or permanent residence visa.

Core topics

Compulsory subjects that form the basis of a study program.

Course

A program of study leading to a degree or diploma.

Course coordinator

The staff member who is responsible for a particular course. The course coordinator is your main contact person at the university. The course coordinator will advise you on matters like enrolment, topic selection, study program, and problems with study. The course coordinator consults with Enrolment Services in authorising your enrolment in topics, amendment of enrolment and withdrawal from topics for your course.

Credit

Credit is sometimes given for relevant topics or units previously studied, for which a student is given an exemption.

CRICOS

The Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) is an Australian government register that lists all Australian education providers offering courses to people studying in Australia on student visas and the courses offered.

Diploma

A formal qualification usually requiring the equivalent of two years of full-time study. At Flinders, the diploma can be studied as a qualifying program for students who do not meet the entry requirements for a bachelor degree.

Elective topics

Topics that can be chosen to support core topics – often called optional topics in science degrees.

English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS)

Programs for students who require English language training before commencing formal studies in Australia.

Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA)

Australia's national research evaluation framework. Excellence in Research for Australia identifies and promotes excellence across the full spectrum of research activity in Australia's higher education institutions.

External student

A person undertaking all of their study by correspondence on either a full-time or a part-time basis, and who is enrolled as an external student.

Flinders Learning Online (FLO)

Flinders University's core online learning and teaching application.

Flinders University Student Association (FUSA)

The on-campus student organisation that exists for the purpose of representing students' rights and interests.

Flinders International Study Centre (ISC)

Flinders International Study Centre (ISC) offers academic English preparation (AEP), foundation and diploma programs for students who seek to qualify for Flinders undergraduate courses.

Foundation Program

The Foundation Program is a comprehensive academic program that prepares students for university-level learning.

Graduate

A person who has received his or her degree.

Graduation

A ceremony at which degrees are conferred and diplomas awarded, and is usually held in April and December.

Honours degree

Awarded to undergraduate students who choose to complete an additional year of study. In the case of four-year degree programs, honours may be awarded to students who perform particularly well.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

Measures the language proficiency of people who want to study or work where English is used as a language of communication.

Innovative Research Universities (IRU)

Innovative Research Universities (IRU) is a network of six comprehensive universities across Australia committed to inclusive excellence in teaching and research.

International Network Universities (INU)

A global consortium comprised of higher education institutions that actively seek international partnerships and experiences, create innovative programming and delivery methods, and embrace the internationalisation movement.

International Student Barometer (ISB)

The global benchmark for the international student experience conducted by iGraduate.

Intensives

Where a topic is studied over a short period of time (eg. week or weekend) with the same number of contact hours as a semester length topic.

International Student Services (ISS)

International Student Services (ISS) is the first point of contact for international students and offers a range of programs supporting your enrolment, study and social life, as well as a referral service to facilities on campus and within the local community.

Major sequence

A sequence of topics that must be taken in all three years of a degree.

Minor sequence

A small number of topics in one area of study.

New Venture Institute (NVI)

New Venture Institute is the centre of innovation and entrepreneurship at Flinders University. Through programs and activities they aim to inspire, connect and educate future generations of entrepreneurs and innovators.

Pearson Test of English (PTE)

Pearson Test of English is an English language test for students wishing to enrol in Englishspeaking universities.

Postgraduate courses

Students must normally have an undergraduate degree to begin studying any postgraduate course; this is sometimes known as graduate studies

Prerequisite

A topic that must be completed before a higherlevel topic can be studied; it is the student's responsibility to ensure that topic prerequisites have been met.

Pre-masters program

A qualifying program for students who do not meet the entry requirements for a postgraduate masters degree.

Semester

The academic year is divided into two semesters – usually late February to mid June, and late July to November.

Student Learning Centre (SLC)

The Student Learning Centre (SLC) is a multidisciplinary academic support service for Flinders University students.

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

A standardised test to measure the English language ability of non-native speakers wishing to enrol in English-speaking universities.

opic

A subject that is studied as part of a degree program.

Topic codes

Topic codes consist of a four-character alpha code followed by a four-digit code. These eight characters form the total topic code, eg. EDUC1120 Teaching and Educational Contexts. These should be quoted whenever you are making an enquiry about enrolling in a topic.

Undergraduate degree

A first degree.

Unit

The measure of weighting given to a topic as specified in the syllabus for that topic. Each topic is given a weighting in units, roughly proportional to its length. Most full-time students complete 36 units a year to gain the 108 units needed to qualify for their degree if they are undertaking a three-year bachelor degree.

Work-Integrated Learning (WIL)

A program designed to give students the opportunity to link theory and practice with valuable workplace experience while studying.
